In 2007 the Cat Adoption Team continued its double digit adoption growth and rescued, rehabilitated and placed 3,129 cats and kittens. Special needs cats are welcomed and every effort is made to treat these cats and place them into appropriate, safe, caring homes. The hospital's goal is to keep newly adopted cats in the family by treating them quickly and cost-effectively in order to avoid returns and educate owners of the importance of lifetime veterinary care. Veterinary care for low-income families is provided on a case by case basis in order to avoid a loving family pet needing to be relinquished to a shelter or euthanized due to a lack of funds. 2,571 spay/neuter surgeries were performed in 2007, reducing feline overpopulation and increasing the chances of shelter cats finding a home.
