

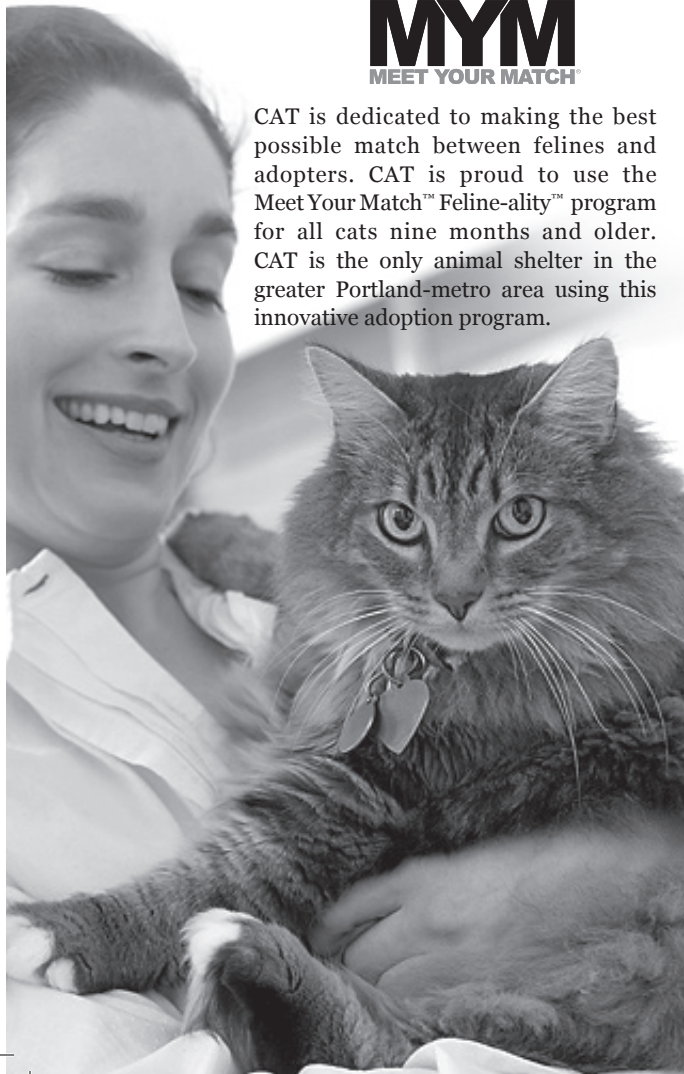
## Come True!

### Adopting from CAT

- Please allow between 1 - 2 hours for your entire visit
- Children under 16 must be accompanied by an adult
- CAT adopts to indoor-only homes
- Adopters must be 18 years or older; provide valid state ID and proof of current residence
- Adoptions close 30 minutes prior to shelter closing
- 20% off an adult cat adoption for senior adopters (62 years and older)



CAT is dedicated to making the best possible match between felines and adopters. CAT is proud to use the Meet Your Match™ Feline-ality™ program for all cats nine months and older. CAT is the only animal shelter in the greater Portland-metro area using this innovative adoption program.



The Cat Adoption Team (CAT), founded in May 1998, is the Pacific Northwest's largest non-profit no-kill feline-only shelter.

CAT's mission is to work with the community to save the lives of homeless, sick, and injured cats and kittens by offering shelter, adoption, foster, hospice, spay/neuter, and veterinary services and to end needless feline euthanasia.

## Where Furry Tales

At the Cat Adoption Team, hundreds of cats and kittens with different personalities and backgrounds are available for adoption. Many came to CAT healthy, simply in need of a home. Others came to CAT suffering from injuries or illness, and are healed in CAT's care. Some are seniors, some are young, and some are FIV+. All are great companions awaiting their loving home.

**CAT encourages pair adoptions:**  
 receive \$20 off your total adoption fee when you adopt two cats/kittens at the same time.



### Adoption Fees

**Includes:** medical examination, spay/neuter surgery, testing for FeLV and FIV, vaccinations, microchip and registration, parasite treatment, cat care booklet, food sample, and cat litter.

In 2002, the Cat Adoption Team became the first animal shelter in Oregon to open a full-service onsite veterinary hospital.

CAT is committed to the overall health of each cat in our care. CAT's veterinary team not only provides examinations, vaccinations, and other preventive care, but also treats cats for conditions ranging from upper respiratory infections ("kitty colds") to bone fractures and diabetes.

Cats are euthanized only if their condition is untreatable or their quality of life is poor.

CAT is committed to reducing feline euthanasia in the Portland area and the birth of unwanted kittens in our community by ensuring all cats and kittens are spayed or neutered prior to adoption.

**Spay/Neuter Services:**

CAT offers subsidized spay/neuter programs to help cat owners in need of financial assistance. CAT proudly participates in the Oregon Spay/Neuter Fund by offering reduced-priced spay/neuter surgeries through OSNF coupons. CAT's feline hospital is equipped with a dual surgery suite, fully stocked pharmacy, x-ray room, isolation room, laboratory, and diagnostic capabilities.

**Save a Life!**

As a CAT volunteer, you play a direct role in helping homeless cats and kittens. Whether matching cats with adoptive families, providing direct animal care, or serving in one of many other positions, our dedicated team of volunteers is essential to CAT's mission and success.

**Opportunities await you!**

**Caregiving:** *Work directly with cats to make their stay at the shelter comfortable.*

**Matchmaking:** *Help families find a cat who is a good fit for them.*

**Adoption outreach:** *Make a difference for a select group of cats at a CAT outreach adoption center. (Located throughout the Portland metro area)*

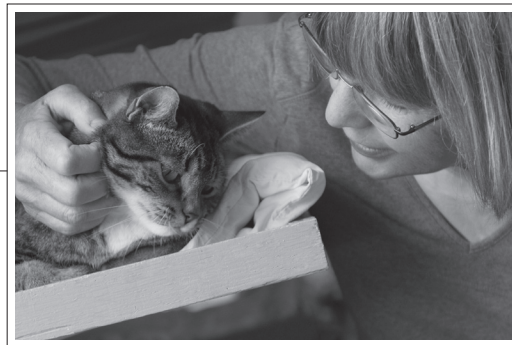
**Digital photography/web writing:** *Promote CAT's cats through creative photography and writing for CAT's adoption list on [PetFinder.com](http://PetFinder.com)*

**Cat Cuddling:** *Get fuzzy! Socialize, play with, and comfort cats.*

**Special events:** *Be a CAT Ambassador at many community events.*

**Other opportunities include:** *Veterinary assistance, office work, and event planning.* Experienced volunteers often assume leadership roles.

CAT volunteers commit a minimum of eight hours a month for at least six months.



**To Volunteer:**

- Submit completed application
- Meet minimum age requirements:
  - 12 years old to volunteer with parent at shelter
  - 14 to volunteer with parent at outreach
  - 16 to volunteer with parental consent
- Attend required training

**Get Involved!**

CAT's 175+ foster families care for more than 1,400 cats and kittens annually. They offer a safe, caring place for a mom cat to raise her kittens, orphaned kittens to grow strong and healthy, or for sick, injured, or special needs cats to heal.

Foster for CAT and experience the joyful chaos of kittens! Or, open your heart and home to an injured cat who just needs a quiet place to heal.

CAT foster families are teamed up with an experienced foster volunteer mentor who provides answers and support. Foster families are given a kitten "baby bag" full of supplies to help you give your foster kittens a loving start to a long life.

**To Foster:**

- Submit a completed application
- Have a safe, indoor place in your home for foster pets
- Be able to travel to and from Sherwood shelter
- Attend required training



**Foster Requirements:**

- Separate room for fosters
- Keep indoor only
- Maintain medical treatment records
- Socialize and play with fosters

**Open Your Heart and Home!**

**Help the Cats with Your Donation**

CAT is a private, nonprofit feline shelter that receives no government funds or tax dollars. As a 501(c)(3) charity, CAT relies on the generous support of the public and volunteers. Your donation to CAT makes a difference and saves lives.

**Your Gift of:**

**\$25** will supply medications for 10 cats with colds or vaccinate and spay one female cat.

**\$50** provides vaccinations and parasite treatments for a litter of kittens.

**\$100** will pay for sheltering, altering, and adopting a healthy cat to a new family.

**\$250** will sponsor a special medical case where a cat may need orthopedic or other surgical care.

**\$500** will sponsor a free-roam room at the shelter by providing food, litter, and toys for that room's feline residents as they await new homes.

**\$1,000** alters 10 litters of kittens and their moms through CAT's spay/neuter programs to break the cycle of cat overpopulation and end needless feline euthanasia.
