

## Cat Food Bank opens in Sherwood

SHERWOOD, Ore. - A Cat Food Bank is opening to help cat owners feed their felines, so that no pet cat will go without food or end up in a shelter due to the owner's hard times.

The food bank seeks donations of unopened, unexpired cat or kitten food. The food will be made available to cat owners in financial need living in any Oregon county.



Sherwood's Cat Adoption Team (CAT) Cat Food Bank opens on Sunday, June 1 and will operate on the first Sunday of each month from 12 – 4 p.m. at 14175 SW Galbreath Drive in Sherwood.

The bank is designed to help cat owners, not feral cat caregivers or rescue organizations.

“If receiving a bag of cat food will help a family keep their pet in the home, then the Cat Adoption Team wants to be able to provide that family with the food,” remarks CAT Executive Director Aaron Asmus. “As the cost of basic necessities increase, CAT knows many pet owners will face hard decisions. The Cat Adoption Team hopes this Cat Food Bank will make it easier for families to keep their companion cats.”

### Guidelines

- Cat and kitten food only
- Distributed to cat owners in need of financial assistance
- Approximately one month's supply of cat food given for up to four cats
- Open the first Sunday of the month (starting June 1) from 12 – 4 p.m.
- No transportation provided to CAT's Sherwood shelter
- Donations of unopened, unexpired cat/kitten food (dry and canned) are welcome
- Available to any cat owner in financial need regardless of what county they reside
